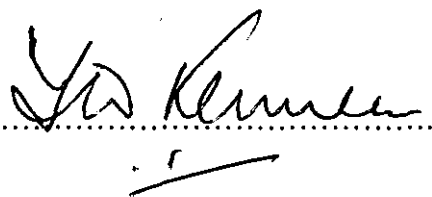

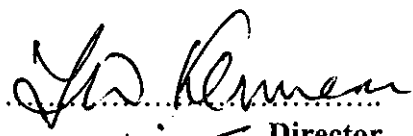

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2000

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation of accounts

The financial statements have been prepared under the Historical Cost Convention, and incorporate the results of the principal activity which is described in the Report of the Directors and which is continuing. The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Statements 1 from the requirement to prepare a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

(b) Turnover

Turnover represents sales of goods, sales made on behalf of third parties and commissions received on those sales.

(c) Depreciation of Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write-off the cost of fixed assets less their estimated residual values over their expected useful lives on the following basis. The rate applied in respect of Furniture and Fittings was 15%
