Strategic report for the year ended 30 June 2017

The directors present their strategic report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2017.

Development, performance and position

As shown in the Company's statement of income on page 7, the Company's turnover for the year is £4,140,143 (2016 - £3,889,430) an increase of 6%. This is largely attributable to two projects completed during the year for clients, a 1,600m² office constructed in Bury St Edmunds and a children's day nursery built in Huntingdon. The Company also sold some further development land, principally its remaining land at the Opus Business Park in Peterborough. In addition, the Company earned project management fees from one project which hasn't proceeded to contract. The Company made a profit before tax for the year of £309,761 (2016 - £392,648).

The statement of financial position on page 8 of the financial statements shows the Company's financial position at the end of the year. Stocks have reduced by £303,737 to £2,267,045 as the result of the sale of land in the year. The cash balance at the year end increased to £660,109 (2016: £344,443).

As a result of accumulated losses in previous years the Company has net liabilities at the year end of £2,660,832. The year ended with freehold land holdings amounting to circa 5,163m² (2016 - 6,868 m²). All of this land has planning permission, most of it detailed. There are no completed stock properties at the year end (2016 - none).

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Company's operations are clearly affected by the economic outlook and the actions and anticipated actions of the Monetary Policy Committee of the Bank of England, not least because the purchase of a property is normally a significant commitment by our purchaser. This risk is mitigated by having a number of business parks in different locations and with a mixture of offices and industrial units of varying sizes. Also, the Company's business model is weighted towards achieving forward sales as this has the advantage that we are able to build units to meet our customers' exact requirements in terms of size and specification whilst at the same time limiting our exposure to unsold stock.

The ability to secure land for development is key to the Company's ongoing success and expansion. Senior management time is devoted to identifying and evaluating potential sites, supplemented by close relationships with agents, and a rigorous process for considering and approving land purchases.

The planning process is uncertain. Where possible land acquisition terms are linked to the grant of planning permission. However, the timing of planning permission can become elongated and this can affect the delivery of intended sales within any given accounting year.

Contracts with clients outside of the Artisan Group will normally be on terms that reduce the risk of non-payment, including the requirement for regular monthly payments against valuation or, less frequently, payments against pre-agreed development milestones.

Health and safety is of paramount importance and a high standard of health and safety management is promoted at all levels in the Company. This is achieved through training programmes and health and safety rules that are backed up by a process of external auditing by suitably qualified consultants.

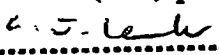

Report of the directors for the year ended 30 June 2017

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2017.

Results and dividends

The statement of income is set out on page 7 and shows the profit for the year.

An interim dividend of £Nil per share (2016 - £Nil) was paid during the year. The directors have not proposed a final dividend for the year (2016 - £Nil).

Principal activities

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Artisan (UK) plc. The principal activity of the Company in the year under review was that of a commercial property development company. The Company designs and develops attractive, modern, purpose built offices and light industrial space on its business park sites concentrated in East Anglia and also works as a developer with clients on their own land. The Company provides clients with services covering all aspects of the development project and leads the delivery of the new property. There were no significant changes in the Company's principal activities in the year under review. The directors are not aware, at the date of this report, of any likely major changes in the Company's activities in the next year.

Environment

The Company recognises the importance of its environmental responsibilities and aims to comply with all relevant environmental legislation. In particular, it aims to ensure that its designs meet the latest building regulations and the requirements of its customers.

A high standard of health and safety management is promoted at all levels within the Company. The Company maintains training programmes, health and safety rules, monitoring and auditing procedures in order to promote a high level of awareness and commitment.

For this reason they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Qualifying third party indemnity provisions (as defined in Section 234 of the Companies Act 2006) are in force for directors who held office during the year.

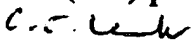
Auditors

Independent auditors' report

TO THE MEMBERS OF ARTISAN (UK) DEVELOPMENTS LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Artisan (UK) Developments Limited for the year ended 30 June 2017 which comprise the statement of income and retained earnings, the statement of financial position, the statement of changes in equity and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 *The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland* (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

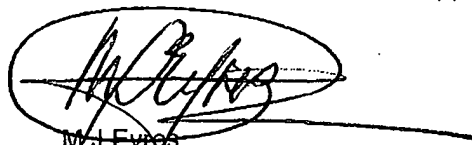

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The financial statements are presented in pounds sterling which is the company's functional currency and rounded to the nearest pound. The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the company's accounting policies. Details of these are given below.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Company disclosure exemptions

In preparing the financial statements of the company, advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemptions available in FRS 102, as a result of the parent company, Artisan (UK) plc, preparing consolidated financial statements including the company. These financial statements are available at Companies House.

- No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.
- Disclosures in respect of the company's financial instruments have not been presented as equivalent disclosures have been provided in the consolidated accounts.

Turnover

Turnover represents the value of work done, including management charges to other group companies and properties sold, excluding VAT. Profit is recognised on long term work in progress contracts if the final outcome can be assessed with reasonable certainty, by including in the profit and loss account turnover and related costs as contract activity progresses. Turnover is calculated as that proportion of total contract value which costs to date bear to total expected costs for that contract. Turnover arises solely in the UK. In respect of sales of property, turnover and profit are recognised upon legal completion of the legal transfer of title to the customer.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual values, of all fixed assets, except freehold land, evenly over their expected useful lives. It is calculated at the following rates:

Plant and machinery	- 33% on cost
Fixtures and fittings and office equipment	- 25% on cost
Leasehold improvements	- 20% on cost

Stocks and work in progress

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost including relevant overheads and net realisable value. Work in progress includes materials, labour and an appropriate proportion of relevant overhead costs incurred on incomplete contracts and developments at the year end. Profit is recognised on long term contracts as stated above. Net realisable value is the amount that the company expects to realise from the sale of stock in the ordinary course of business, after allowing for the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale. It is assumed that sites will be completed and sold in line with the company's intended development plans. In the event land or partly completed sites were sold without completing the development the amounts realised would be lower and may be below the carrying value in these accounts.

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date except that:

- the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the Company anticipates to make sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences.

Deferred tax balances are not discounted.

Leased assets

Leases where the lessor retains substantially all of the risks and benefits of ownership are classified as operating leases. Operating lease rental charges are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the term of each lease.

Pensions

The Company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable for the year are charged in the profit and loss account. The cost for the year is shown in note 3 to the accounts.

Dividends

Equity dividends are recognised when they become legally payable. Final equity dividends are recognised when approved by the shareholders at an annual general meeting.

Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements, the directors have made the following key judgements and estimates:

- In arriving at its assessment of going concern the Company has considered the availability of working capital which is provided by the Group. Projections have been prepared by the Group which, taking into account its current financial position and its expected ability to raise new finance to support the acquisition and development of new sites and reasonably possible changes in trading performance, show that the Group will be able to operate within the level of its current and anticipated facilities. Further, the Directors have obtained a letter of support from the Parent Company which stated its intention to continue to provide such financial support as the Company requires for its continued operations for a period of not less than one year from the date of this report. In view of this the Directors are satisfied that the Company has adequate resources to continue operating for the foreseeable future. For this reason they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.
- Carrying value of land and work in progress and estimation of costs to complete. The Company holds stocks stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Judgements and estimates have been made by management in relation to both the net realisable value and cost of stock. Net realisable value is the net amount that the Company expects to realise from the sale of stock in the ordinary course of business, i.e. assuming sites are completed and sold in line with the Company's intended development plans. Furthermore, due to the nature of the Company's activity, and in particular the size and length of the development cycle, the Company has to allocate site wide developments costs between units being built or completed in the current year and those for future years. In doing this it also has to forecast the costs to complete on such developments. The Company also has to consider the proportion of overheads that it is appropriate to allocate to stock. In making such assessments and allocations, there is a degree of inherent estimation uncertainty. The Company has established internal controls designed to effectively assess and review stock carrying values and ensure the appropriateness of the estimates made.

The Company is a 100% subsidiary of Artisan (UK) plc, a company registered in England and Wales. Artisan (UK) plc is the holding company for the Artisan Group. The financial statements of Artisan (UK) plc are available from 2b Vantage Park, Washingley Road, Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire, PE29 6SR.

At 30 June 2017 Aspen Finance Limited ("Aspen") owned 69.5% of the share capital of Artisan (UK) plc. Aspen is a private limited company whose principal activity is to act as a holding company for an investment in Artisan. Aspen is wholly owned by Aspen Group Inc which in turn is owned by the Brownis Trust. The Board understand that the Brownis Trust is the ultimate controlling party.
